As a result of this class, students will design, develop, and articulate their personal leadership philosophy, rooted in ethics and spirituality, and create a toolkit of practices that will nurture that philosophy over time. The final project will support and deepen a real-world entrepreneurial initiative in socio-ecological change, such as the Laudato Si Action Platform.
